

Our Lady of the Rosary Catholic Primary School

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Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been a busy few weeks with lots of learning taking place both indoors and out in spite of the change in temperature! We are pleased that despite many absences due to Covid with staff and children we seem to be over the worst with only 8% of children absent this week due to Covid. Thank you for your patience and understanding when staffing has had to be swapped due to Covid and in the nursery case when we were forced to close for a number of days. We have all classes and nursery fully open and all staff back in school. It will be lovely when we can begin to mix as a whole school and children can catch up with friends across the school.

We are delighted to welcome new children to Our Lady of the Rosary this term, and our welcome is extended to their families with whom we hope to share a long, happy, and successful relationship. We again hope to begin inviting parents and carers into school as we move towards planning parent and carer coffee mornings and parent/carer workshops.

<u>Attendance</u>

As a school, we are duty-bound to follow up on any pupils who are not attending school or are regularly late for school. To ensure we fulfil this duty please continue to support us with the internal process that we have in place to monitor attendance. We are fully aware of how Covid has impacted on attendance and fully appreciate your support in ensuring that the majority of our children are attending school. We continue to ask parents/carers to keep us informed of any illness by telephoning the school office; if we are not informed non-attendance will not be authorised and could lead to a fine. Please be reminded that holidays in term time will not be authorised except in exceptional circumstances and must be applied for. Both parents could be fined for taking children out of school for a holiday during term time. School does not benefit from fining parents and do not receive the money from the fine. We would like to avoid this route in all cases. Please talk to us if you are concerned about your child's attendance and engage with us if we do invite you into a meeting about your child's attendance. Please note no holidays will be authorised for any reason for any of our Year 6 children during SATS week which is **9th May 2022 to 12th May 2022**.

Reading

At Our Lady of the Rosary, we consider reading to be one of the most important skills that our children learn; it is the key to unlocking the world, affecting all areas of your child's learning and development. We pledge to ensure your child reads everyday through a range of reading rich experiences; we ask for your support in ensuring your child reads for 10 minutes a day at home, to maximise their reading progress!



Your child will access an e-book on Scholastic Reading Pro Library. Their access will be monitored by the class teacher on a weekly basis, with the expectation that pupils access this at home for 10 minutes a day. When your child has finished reading the book, they can click the button at the top of the screen to take the quiz. This is not an option on all e-books but will be for most. Safer Internet Day 2022

On **8**th **February** we celebrate Safer Internet Day – an annual global event promoting safe and positive use of digital technology for children and young people.

This year, Safer Internet Day will focus on exploring respect and relationships online. This is a great opportunity to discuss with your children how they navigate the online world safely. Social Media can be a wonderful tool for keeping in touch with people and also what is happening in the world. For many Social Media accounts there are age limits set as some of the content that is posted is unsuitable for younger children. This age limit is usually 13 which means that, in theory, none of our children should be accessing things like Instagram, Facebook or Snapchat.

Increasingly, we hear about children sending inappropriate messages over these things which can have a knock on effect in school. As far as the school is concerned the responsibility for monitoring Social Media use is down to parents, not the school. However, we continue to promote and teach Internet safety in school. Please speak to us if you need help with keeping your child safe online.

We will upload onto Facebook work produced by the children in school and ideas for how you can support at home.
