### Term Highlights

The past term has been full of great progress and fun. In Writing, children have written letters to describe our country to refugees and they also enjoyed writing their own fairy tale with a twist. In Maths, we have focused on Fractions and decimals – and most recently using our experience of decimals to explore pounds and pence in money. In RE, we learnt about self-discipline through our Lent and Easter topic and explored key parts of the Eucharist through our giving and receiving topic. In Science, we developed our knowledge of states of matter including particle models, whilst in Geography we studied coasts, particularly exploring the impacts and defenses of coastal erosion. In Computing, children have developed their skills using Power point to create a presentation about fairytale characters.
