 Log on to Times Tables Rock Stars. Watch out for an upcoming battle!



This half term

In writing, we have been using a range of skills to write persuasive letters and fictional diary entries.

In Maths, we have been exploring numbers and their value up to 1,000,000. This knowledge will give us the skills to complete calculations using the four operations $(+ - x \div)$.

R.E., we have discussed and made links about our role as individual children of God and how God wants us to be ourselves and share our qualities and talents.

In geography, we have been discussing settlements and how they change over time.

In art, we have been learning to draw portraits.

In computing we've been exploring computer systems and their role in our day to day lives.

In Science we've learnt about Earth and Space, whilst exploring ideas about the solar system.

Reading Expectations

Your child will bring a book home every night and this must be returned to school every day, so children can use it in our daily reading sessions. In year 5, we ask children to take responsibility for recording their reading in their reading log every time that they read. As children become more fluent, we place more emphasis on their understanding of what they have read.
