### **Personal Development**

In Personal Development, we have been talking about relationships and how our bodies change as we grow older. The children have discussed what gifts and talents they have and what they are proud of. We've discussed how to appreciate individuality and recognise the influences of society and media to make us feel like we have to act and look certain ways. Children have shown maturity and confidence discussing these themes.

## What we've been learning...

**In writing**, we have been using a range of skills to write biographies. We are currently writing a legend about Beowulf.

**In Maths,** we have and will continue to be working with fractions and looking at the relationship between fractions, decimals and percentages. As a class, we have been practising our arithmetic skills.

**R.E.,** we have discussed and made links about the sacrifices we make and how this links to Jesus' ultimate sacrifice. We have just started our new topic of Transformations—which links to Pentecost, the period following Easter.

In Reading, we are currently reading Varjak
Paw by SF Said. Last term we enjoyed a virtual author visit from Tony Bradman and we
asked questions about our previous class
text 'Viking Boy.'

In Geography, we have been discussing natural resources and we have debated why we should you renewable energy over non-renewable energy.

**In Art,** we have been learning about cubism with reference to the artist Pablo Picasso.

**In Computing** we've been using a green screen to record and edit videos . This term we will be exploring and creating databases.

#### **Reading Expectations**

Your child will bring a book home every night and this must be returned to school every day, so children can use it in our daily reading sessions. In year 5, we ask children to take responsibility for recording their reading in their reading log every time that they read. As children become more fluent, we place more emphasis on their understanding of what they have read.

Please can you listen (at least twice per week) to your child read and ask questions around their understanding.
